

The Southern Ohio ESC proudly serves as the fiscal agent for the Hopewell Center, a partnership that underscores our commitment to fostering educational and support services in our community. Under the leadership of Jeff Royalty, Director of the Hopewell Center, the collaboration extends its reach even further. Mr. Royalty spearheads the initiatives at the Hopewell Center and serves as the Director of State Support Team Region 14, demonstrating an unwavering commitment to enhancing educational outcomes. This partnership exemplifies a shared vision of providing comprehensive support and resources, ensuring that every individual has the opportunity to succeed.





RELATED SERVICES

"Related services" refers to developmental, corrective, and other supportive services required to assist a child with a disability to benefit from special education, and includes speech language pathology and audiology services, interpreting services, psychological services, physical and occupational therapy, recreation, including therapeutic recreation, early identification and assessment of disabilities in children, counseling services, including rehabilitation counseling, orientation and mobility services, and medical services for diagnostic or evaluation purposes. Related services also include school health services and school nurse services, social work services in schools, and parent counseling and training.

Adaptive Physical Education (APE)

Our **Adaptive Physical Education Specialists** modify the environment and activities of the physical education setting to increase the rate of success for the students with physical and cognitive impairments. We provide both direct and consultative services depending upon the needs of the child. Our APE specialists attend ETR & IEP meetings and, when appropriate, write goals and document the progress of students on their caseloads.

Audiological and Deaf/Hard of Hearing

Our **Deaf/Hard of Hearing Intervention Specialists** provide direct instruction to children with hearing loss and complete assessments to support student learning. In addition, our specialists provide support and resources for students, school personnel, and families.

Our **Educational Interpreters** are licensed interpreters who provide interpretation of spoken language into sign language, are a voice for their students and act as a language facilitator.

Our **Educational Audiologist** provides training, testing, support, and maintenance of school-provided equipment.

School Psychology

Our **School Psychologists** provide comprehensive support to enhance student well-being and academic success. Our psychologists offers assessment, intervention, and consultation services, addressing mental health, learning, and behavioral challenges. By working closely with educators, parents, and students, our school psychologists help create positive, supportive, and effective learning environments for the students they serve.

Autism/Low-Incidence Disabilities Consultation

Our **Educational Consultant** provides individual student consultation to support the implementation of evidence-based strategies to meet the unique needs of students with low-incidence disabilities through on-site training and coaching.



Early Childhood Intervention Specialist (ECIS)/Preschool Itinerant Teaching

Our Early Childhood Intervention Specialist **Itinerant Teachers** provide high-quality preschool experiences in enriching environments. In this program, we serve children ages 3-5. Our specialists design learning experiences to meet the unique needs of each individual child, providing instruction to young children with disabilities and consultation to families and educators to best serve the needs of the children served.

School Social Worker

Our **Social Workers** support students' academic, emotional, and social well-being by providing counseling, crisis intervention, conflict resolution, and connecting families with community resources. They collaborate with school staff to create a positive and inclusive environment, advocating for students' needs to ensure their success and well-being.

Occupational Therapy (OT/COTA)

Our Occupational Therapists and Certified Occupational Therapy Assistants enhance a student's ability to fully access and be successful in the learning environment. Services provided include working on handwriting and fine motor skills, learning to use school tools such as scissors, helping students organize themselves in the environment (including workspace and personal belongings), working with educators to modify the classroom, and adapting learning materials to facilitate successful participation for each child.

Speech-Language Pathology (SLP)

Our Speech-Language Pathologists assess, diagnose, and treat communication and swallowing disorders in students. Our speech therapists provide individualized therapy to improve speech, language, and social communication skills, working closely with educators and families to support student success. Through targeted interventions and collaborative efforts, our SLPs help students achieve their full communicative potential.

Physical Therapy (PT/PTA)

Our Physical Therapists and Physical Therapy Assistants provide educationally-based physical therapy that supports the inclusion of students within their educational environment. Schoolbased physical therapy services that are provided include posture and mobility skills, gross motor activities, transitions, and safety and equipment needs within the school setting.

Visual Impairment (VI)

Our Itinerant Teachers of the Visually Impaired and **Certified Orientation and Mobility Specialists** provide a wide range of services to students and school districts. SUPPLEMENTARY ASSISTANCE TO THE HANDICAPPED

S.A.T.H. is a non-profit organization that assists children with disabilities by sponsoring programs like KAMP Dovetail that enhance the quality of their lives.

S.A.T.H. FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The S.A.T.H. Scholarship is awarded to a high school senior identified with a disability and plans to pursue post-secondary education or training. Applicants must submit an essay detailing their life goals and the strategies they intend to use to achieve them. A committee from S.A.T.H. evaluates each application, and the student with the highest score receives the \$500 scholarship.

Established in 2005 by the S.A.T.H. Board of Trustees, the S.A.T.H. Scholarship has provided over \$10,000 in scholarships to district students. The school districts contribute to this financial award through a yearly S.A.T.H. District Fellowship membership.
