 - a. Terri Bennett, Ohio College Tech Prep-Sw Region-explained the Ohio Tech Prep-serve as a liaison between career tech and Ohio Dept. of Education. Help students matriculate to college through the various phases. Has been assisting Southern Hills CTC in Brown County. Assist with the work based learning experiences for CTC's and schools. Covers southwest and Adams-Brown and Highland. Liaison for Business and Advisory Council's at the state level. Working with Southern State Community College.
 - b. Kara Juillerat and students (Noah Moermond, Airanna Harbottle): Tech Students from Eastern Brown Middle School explained their career projects that they have been developing using web based programs.
