# Congratulations to our band and vocal department performers

Johnstown-Monroe students had a very successful day at the Ohio Music Education Association Solo & Ensemble Day, held Jan. 28, at Granville High School.

Students (participation was optional) worked since December to prepare a solo piece or an ensemble (trios and quartets) to perform at the 2023 OMEA Solo & Ensemble Adjudicated Event. Students earn a rating of either a I, II, III, IV, or V (I is the highest); I- Superior and II- Excellent.

The band had 25 events, with 14 earning a Superior Rating, 10 earning an Excellent Rating, and 1 ensemble performed for comments only (no rating provided.)

The vocal department had 19 events with 16 Superior Ratings and 3 Excellent Ratings.

Sitting in the transportation facility on a chilly February morning after dropping off students, Wayne Johnson recalled that not long after he first started driving Johnstown buses, a former J-M school superintendent thanked him for his warmth and lack of negativity.


