SCHOOL MEAL PROGRAM ARREARS

The school meal program shall make a nutritionally adequate meal (breakfast and/or lunch) available to every student and shall operate on the most economically feasible basis. No school staff member shall:

- ➣ Publicly identify or stigmatize an unsubsidized student who cannot pay for a school breakfast or a school lunch or whose school breakfast or school lunch bill that is in arrears, for example, by requiring serving the student an alternative meal; that the student sit at a separate table or wear a wristband, hand stamp, or identifying mark or by
- Ġ Require an unsubsidized student who cannot pay for a school breakfast or a school lunch or whose breakfast or school lunch; or school breakfast or school lunch bill that is in arrears to do chores or other work to pay for the school
- O Require an unsubsidized student to discard a school breakfast or school lunch after it has been money is owed for previously provided meals. served because of the student's inability to pay for a school breakfast or a school lunch or because

An unsubsidized student shall not be denied access to a school meal, regardless of the student's ability to pay or the status of the student's meal arrearages, during any period of time in which the school is making a determination as to whether the student is eligible for and can be certified to receive, free or reduced

Payment of Charges

arrears, The school business administrator shall be responsible for tracking and billing all lunch accounts in The following guidelines shall apply:

- ➣ Charges will show a negative account balance on the student's school meal program account, and billed, at a minimum, quarterly to the parent/guardian;
- œ Payments on charges shall be brought directly to the main office or mailed to the main office
- Ç The payment shall be recorded and a receipt generated and given or mailed in acknowledgement of payment received according to the established school business procedures.
